Background

Susan O'Regan is the Mayor of Waipā, a business owner, farmer and mother of five. Born and raised here she comes from a family with deep roots in both farming and public service. Susan holds degrees in Law and Political Science from University of Otago. She began her career in the Beehive as a Ministerial Assistant before moving into family law, practicing in both Auckland and the Waikato. She went on to establish her own successful chambers in Te Awamutu and closed these in 2010 to focus on family and farming. Together with her husband, John Hayward, Susan developed their 240-hectare Roto-o-rangi dairy farm; Judge Valley Dairies, into a nationally recognised example of sustainable farming. The farm has received major accolades, including Waikato Supreme Award at the Ballance Farm Environment Awards and top honours in the Dairy Business of the Year awards. Alongside her professional career, Susan has contributed extensively in governance. First elected to Waipā District Council in 2016, she served two terms as a councillor, the second as Chairperson of the Strategic Planning and Policy Committee, before becoming Mayor in 2022. As Mayor, Susan plays additional key roles in regional initiatives such as Waikato Water Done Well and the Future Proof partnership, which brings together iwi, councils, and central government. She is a Crown appointee to the Waikato River Authority, a trustee of Sport Waikato, and a member of the LGNZ Electoral Reform Working Group. Alongside her public service, Susan is a proud mother of five. She balances the responsibilities of leadership with the realities of family and farm. Her life reflects a strong blend of professional achievement, farming success, community service, and family commitment. As Mayor of Waipā, I bring proven and unparalleled experience to the role. I understand the realities of leading a complex organisation, working with elected members, and delivering for the whole community. As a collaborative leader, I am skilled at building consensus as evidenced by unanimous support on key matters such as the Long Term Plan and regional water reform.
